CODE OF ETHICS TO CHECK MALPRACTICES AND PLAGIARISM IN RESEARCH

PREAMBLE:

The two most crucial aspects of academic activities, including teaching and research, are ethics and honesty. A new profession built on exceedingly high moral standards is teaching and research. There is no room for claiming credit for work that has not been done. Such behavior's will impair the institution's academic environment and the reputation of both the institution and the individual.

PLAGIARISM:

Plagiarism is the act of passing off someone else's thoughts and words as one's own without giving due credit. Plagiarism is the act of copying passages from works that have been published or unpublished that go beyond the scope of acceptable collaboration without giving credit to the original author.

TYPES OF PLAGIARISM:

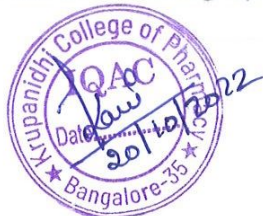
Plagiarism could be of two types –

- Negligent OR unintentional plagiarism: This refers to presenting someone else's work as one's own without giving due credit to the original author.
- Intentional OR dishonest plagiarism: This refers to presenting someone else's work as one's own work without giving due credit to the original author.

RESEARCH MISCONDUCT:

Research misconduct is defined as Fabrication, Falsification, or Plagiarism (FFP) in the design, conduct, or review of a study, as well as in the reporting of its findings.

- Falsification is the modifying or omitting of data or outcomes so that the research is not accurately reflected in the research record by manipulating study materials, equipment, or methods, or by altering or omitting data or results.
- Fabrication is the act of creating up information to be used in records or reports.



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- Plagiarism is the unwarranted use of another person's thoughts, methods, output, or words without giving due credit.

CODE OF ETHICS:

Plagiarism and ethics are important considerations in research and publication. Researchers have been caught on occasion passing off someone else's work as their own, which harms the institution's reputation.

- ✓ To evaluate faculty researchers and students who produce their work in the form of research publications, research proposals, thesis work, or project reports, an ethical committee made up of all of the institute's Ph.D. holders has been constituted.
- ✓ The research done by staff and students, particularly in the form of papers or projects, must be checked for plagiarism and adhere to strict academic and production standards.
- ✓ The college website provides access to internet plagiarism detection tools. All faculty members seeking to publish a paper are required to submit the work and a plagiarism report (with a maximum percentage of 15%) to the committee for assessment. To get their project work approved for publication or to deliver their thesis, all students are required to submit a plagiarism report (capped at 20%), with no objections from their advisors or co-authors.
- ✓ The research done by staff and students, particularly in the form of papers or projects, must be checked for plagiarism and adhere to strict academic and production standards.
- ✓ Plagiarism complaints and other rule violations are grounds for disciplinary action, which must be taken by the committee within a month of the complaint date.
- ✓ The committee also goes above and above to make sure that the work meets national and international standards.
