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



He also inaugurated "covid-19 special bulletin" and "ACS Academy, Nagpur" and greeted everyone on the occasion of inaugural session, Mr. VIJAY PATIL, President of Maharashtra state council, Mumbai inaugurated "E-bulletin" and also talked to faculties about raising the standards of education in this pandemic period. Dr. MD Sallahuddin, Professor and Principal of Farooqia college of Pharmacy, Mysore delivered key note address on topic "Importance on innovations and Research culture to inculcate startup and entrepreneurship". The session was of full of Knowledge and information which included innovation and its culture for implementation, pillars of innovation, culture for research, different ways to promote research culture and START Ups the need of hour. He also gave example of young entrepreneurs in India who are successful today in business and he also mentioned how positive attitude and patience is important to face various challenges in business.

In the afternoon session, Dr. Mohan Kale explained his views on Entrepreneurship Development Program and guided the faculty members about the importance of entrepreneurship and innovation in institutes. The session was further taken by Dr. Bharat Tekade, Professor, KGRDCP & RI Karjat, who elaborated on the topic "Manufacturing of new drug by loan licence" describing the procedure for loan licensing along with the market scenario.

On second day Nitin Kale, National skill development expert expressed his views on topic "Importance of Innovation and Research culture to inculcate start up and entrepreneurship" Sir explained the basic elements like opportunity recognition, moderate risk taker, creation or innovation, resource gathering and founding of an economic organization, desiring the chance for gain while accepting risk and uncertainty. He also guided participants on how to find the business opportunities, steps in launching an enterprise and prime minister's employment generation programme (PMEGP) and new incentives for START-Ups.

Dr. Vaishali Jadhav HOD/Assistant Professor at KGRDCP delivered her talk on "National innovation and STARTUP policy for higher education Institutions". Dr. Vaishali explained the AICTE policies to be followed by institutes during setting up the new STARTUP in institutes along with collaborating with pre-incubation and incubation centres.

Disha Bilave Lecturer at KGRDCP & RI also expressed her views on topic "An overview of problems and challenges in rural development in India, scope in rural enterprises and steps taken to overcome such problems

He also correlated the skills required according to the scope in the pharmacy field and added how bright is the future of pharma sector.

Ms. Jyoti Shankarrao Lahane Assistant Professor, KGRDCP delivered talk on "How to start a retail pharmacy business" In her talk she described about key points such as selection of location for the store, legal requirements about area, qualifications of the person and the documents to be furnished while applying for drug licence.

Another speaker Amol Borade Assistant Professor KGRDCP shared his views on topic "Ideation and team formation in healthcare startups". He commented on various sources of ideation, different techniques generating ideations, components of team formation, and required skill necessary in team members.

On fourth day Mr. Vijay Bhambulkar, Ex Director, Johnson and Johnson spoke on topic "Cosmeceuticals". He explained in detail the ideas and techniques used to start a cosmeceuticals industry and challenges involved in starting the same. In his talk he mentioned cosmetic regulations, cosmetic safety, herbal cosmetic challenges, and medicinal and toiletry preparations. Difference between pharma and cosmetics field and its overall perspective was also explained by Mr Bhambulkar further elaborating on innovation trends, global trends and India trends. He presented the growing demand for innovatively packed cosmetics. At last he also highlighted the gaps for working on new cosmetic products.

Mrs. Poonam Patil Assistant Professor, KGRDCP & RI Karjat, delivered her talk on success stories of Pharma start-ups. She emphasized that all faculty should inspire their students by sharing success stories which are great source of motivation.

Mr. Hemant Dhakne, Assistant Professor, KGRDCP spoked on "Green India". Conversion of biomass feedstock into activated charcoal is one of the great start-up idea which eventually help to clean and healthy India

On fifth day, Dr.M.K.Kale , Pricipal delivered his talk on topic "A Paradigm shift in Teaching –Learning pedagogic methods in new era". He emphasized on precautions taken while working in pandemic situation like social distancing, hygiene, sanitation. He further added physical and psychological manifestations of COVID- 19 pandemic lockdown and newer trends in pedagogic methods in post COVID-19 pandemic like pedagogy, andragogy, heutagogy, flipped classrooms, Bloom's taxonomy, sources used for dissemination of knowledge. He concluded his talk by explaining do's and don'ts in online education.

In the afternoon session, Mr Pritam Juvatkar shared his views on "Role of Functional Food and Nutraceutical in Cancer Chemosensitisation & Market Scenario". He explained with diagrammatic manner targets of cancer cells for the treatment and mechanism of chemoresistance. He elaborated on how to overcome the chemoresistance with chemosensitization mechanism and how nutraceuticals and phytopharmaceutical will help to target the cancer cells. Nilofer Khan, Assistant Professor KGRDCP, delivered her talk on "License for manufacturing of Ayurvedic medicine". She explained about what is ayurvedic medicine, how to online login e- aushadi portal of ayush details of form filling type of ayush license i.e contract/ third, complete and loan licensing.

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On sixth day Rahul Somani, Sr. Manager Alkem Labs spoke on "Pharmacovigilance and its importance in terms of entrepreneurship and scope involved for the business". In his talk he explained the adverse events, adverse drug reaction, risk with medicines, economic impact of ADR. He explained pharmacovigilance programme of India and its communication. He also added about pharmacovigilance activities, regulatory authority sources, call centers and safety data base.

On seventh day, Binil Balakrishnan, Sanopy delivered his talk on topic "Pharmaceutical Marketing, Brand planning and key emerging trends to watch out". He expressed his thoughts on Brand planning, pharmaceutical marketing, Brand manager role in Pharma, Brand planning process in Pharma and key emerging trends. Mr. Binil also explained five phases of brand messaging, followed by digital therapeutics, Brand pharmaceutical marketing and challenges involved in the field.

Mr. Amol Chandekar Associate Professor KGRDCP delivered his talk on "Entrepreneurship ideas in rural development and remedial measures" He explained the concept of rural entrepreneurship, its Importance and challenges faced by rural entrepreneurs. Vrushali Neve, Assistant Professor, KGRDCP delivered her talk on "Strategic entrepreneurship". She explained if entrepreneur start business with proper strategic plan then definitely he/she will get success and commented on components of strategic entrepreneurship

On eighth day, Mr. Deepesh Khandelwal ,National Trainer shared his views on "N.urture your future (entrepreneur thinking). He guided the participants that every person should have goal and purpose in life, importance of entrepreneurship, four step evaluation to find out your purpose. At the end of the session he also quoted the important statement of Steve Jobs "Being the richest man is the cemetery doesn't matter to me. Going to bed at night saying we have done something wonderful that's what matter to me".

In the afternoon session, Sandeep Waghulde delivered talk on topic "GOVERNMENT SCHEMES FOR ENTREPRENEURS Starting Your Own Business"? . He discussed Govt Schemes Every Entrepreneur Should Know and mentioned how budding entrepreneurs are motivated to kickstart innovative businesses that will eventually create employment opportunities also the government offers innumerable schemes like Atal Incubation Centre (AIC) and NewGEN IEDC to make the process easy.

Mr Ravi Vishwanathan Associate Vice president at Mylan Laboratories shared his views on topic "Validation". Sir highlighted on approaches to validation, prerequisites of validation, scope of validation, documentation, validation master plan, protocols and reports. He also explained in detail the various qualification stages of validation, qualification and validation reports, and changes requiring revalidation.

On ninth day, Mr Pramod Pimplikar, Management Consultant, delivered his talk on "Past current scenario of covid-19". He explained details of covid-19 vaccines and medicines. He also gave the overview about recent corona outbreak, diagnosis of COVID-19, prevention and treatment of covid-19, role of convalescent plasma in covid therapy, vaccines and there side effects. Besides that he also explained prophylactic measures for avoiding the covid infection.

In the afternoon session, Mrs. Rupali Yevale shared her views on "Marketing Research at startup stage". She elaborated on reasons and need of marketing research, problem identification, objectives of marketing research for new product, various types of research design, methods of data collection and its evaluation to fulfill customer demand.

On tenth day, Mr. Maharaj Raina Global Expert delivered his talk on "Entrepreneurship development in cosmeceuticals nutraceuticals, homeopathy, AYUSH medicines, immuno boosters". He covered tissue culture methods, cultivation of medicinal plants, storage of material, ethical marketing, all the entrepreneurship techniques in detail.

On eleventh day in the valedictory function, Mr. Ranjeet Barshikar, CEO- QbD international, UNESCO expressed his thoughts on Faculty development program, its objectives and outcomes. Mr. Barshikar delivered his talk on topic "Challenges and Opportunities in Pharmaceutical companies". He also mentioned how the standards and regulations are updated and changed every 6 months pinpointing the strengthening of the regulations. International Yoga Day Celebration



Career Avenues in Pharmaceuticals








The three-fold purpose of signing this MoU is faculty and student exchange, research and development, and collaborative academic activities.
